

Henry W. Lunt Roadside Park Dedicated Friday

Impressive dedication ceremonies were held Friday afternoon on Buckhorn Flat about ten miles north of Parowan on highway 91, when the Henry W. Lunt Roadside Park was officially opened to the traveling public. The park, which was just recently completed, is a part of the state and federal road commissions' beautification program and was named in honor of the late Henry W. Lunt of Cedar City who served on the Utah State Road Commission for several years and who was instrumental in building better roads throughout this district.

W. D. Hammond, chairman of the State Road Commission, presided at the dedicatory service Friday afternoon, the program for which was as follows: Two selections by a mixed quartet consisting of Vern Jones, Mr. and Mrs. Roy L. Halversen, L. C. Miles, Mrs. William Manning, Mr. and Mrs. Lorenzo Luke and Mrs. Ray Lunt, accompanied by Mrs. Lehi M. Jones, and the congregational singing of "Come, Come Ye Saints;" short talks by County Commissioner Warren H. Bulloch, County Commissioner H. L. Adams, State Road Commissioner Abbot, Landscape Engineer Bowen, Joseph H. Young, highway engineer for the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads, and Preston G. Peterson, also of the State Road Commission and a response by Mayor H. H. Lunt of Cedar City, who is a son of the late Henry W. Lunt. The opening prayer was offered by Bishop Samuel F. Leigh of the Cedar City L. D. S. Third Ward, while the dedicatory prayer was offered by William R. Palmer.
